The Secretariat of the United Nations presents its compliments to the Permanent Missions of Member States to the United Nations and invites Member States to recommend qualified individuals to serve as experts on the Panel of Experts established pursuant to resolution 2206 (2015) on South Sudan, subject to the extension of the Panel's mandate by the Security Council in May 2025.

Nominations are sought for expert positions on the Panel of Experts on South Sudan that will become vacant in July 2025. Recommended candidates should possess a minimum of ten years of progressively responsible experience in the below mentioned areas of expertise and competence, with a minimum of three years of field experience:

- Arms
- Armed Groups
- Regional Issues
- Humanitarian Affairs
- Natural Resources and Finance

The selection process will include an interview and other assessment methods to evaluate candidates' suitability. Sanctions experts are selected on the basis of demonstrated expertise in the relevant area of work, experience and educational background, with due regard to equitable geographic representation and gender balance. English and French are the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat. For these positions, fluency in English is required; knowledge of another UN official language is an advantage.

Appointment duration is in accordance with the mandate of the expert panel established by the Security Council. Experts are hired as consultants in line with the United Nations' administrative instruction concerning consultants and individual contractors (ST/AI/2013/4/Rev.1).
